AIL High School Preparation Course (HSP)

The AIL High School Preparation (HSP) supports international students in developing the linguistic, academic, and social skills needed for success in Australian high schools. The program combines English language learning with subject-based content to ensure students are ready for mainstream classes.

Key educational considerations include:



Academic English Development:

The course builds proficiency in reading, writing, listening, and speaking with a focus on academic contexts. Students learn key vocabulary and concepts in Mathematics, Science, English, and Humanities, while also practicing study strategies such as time management, note-taking, research, and exam preparation. Upon completion, all students sit the AEAS test to confirm readiness for mainstream studies.



✓ **Subject-Specific Language Skills:**

The program includes English for Mathematics, Science, Humanities, IT, and PE. Students learn subject-specific terminology and practice applying it in classwork.

This ensures students can follow subject lessons confidently and communicate effectively.

✓ **Study Skills and Critical Thinking:**

Students practice independent learning skills such as summarising, referencing, and exam preparation. The program also develops critical thinking by encouraging analysis, evaluation, and clear expression of ideas across both written and spoken tasks.

✓ **Cultural Awareness and Integration:**

The curriculum introduces Australian school culture, classroom etiquette, and peer interaction, helping students adapt smoothly to their new learning environment.



The HSP course is structured to ensure students gain the required skills to integrate seamlessly into Australian high schools. The program follows a well-balanced curriculum that includes:



Core English Language Instruction

Focuses on grammar, vocabulary, and communication skills.

Academic Writing and Reading

Develops essay writing, comprehension, and research skills.

Subject-Specific Learning Modules

Covers English for Mathematics, Science, and Humanities to familiarise students with subject expectations.

Study and Exam Skills

Prepares students for assessments with revision techniques, time management, and effective study habits.

Social and cultural integration

Helps young students improve their social and interpersonal skills through interactive classroom activities, group projects, and guided peer collaboration.

In the AIL High School Preparation (HSP) course, time is carefully allocated to each subject area to ensure balanced development of academic English, subject-specific knowledge, and essential study skills. While exact hours may vary slightly depending on student level and program structure, a typical weekly schedule includes:

- **Core English:**

20 hours/ wk

(Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking)

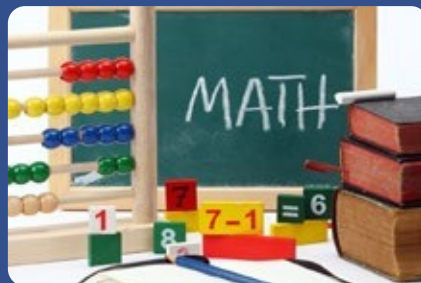
Focuses on academic English development, including grammar, vocabulary, essay writing, and comprehension.



- **English for Mathematics:**

1 hour/wk

Builds subject-specific language skills needed to understand and solve mathematical problems.



- **English for Science:**

1 hour/wk

Introduces scientific language, report writing, and comprehension of science-related texts and experiments.



- **Humanities-related Studies :**

(e.g., History, Geography, Civics)

1 hour/wk

Focuses on history, geography, civics, and economics in Australian contexts.



- **Physical Education (PE):**

1 hour/wk

Supports physical well-being and helps students adapt to group interaction and instruction in English.



- **Study Skills & Critical Thinking Workshops:**

1 hour/wk

Covers time management, research, exam techniques, and reflection to build independent learning habits.

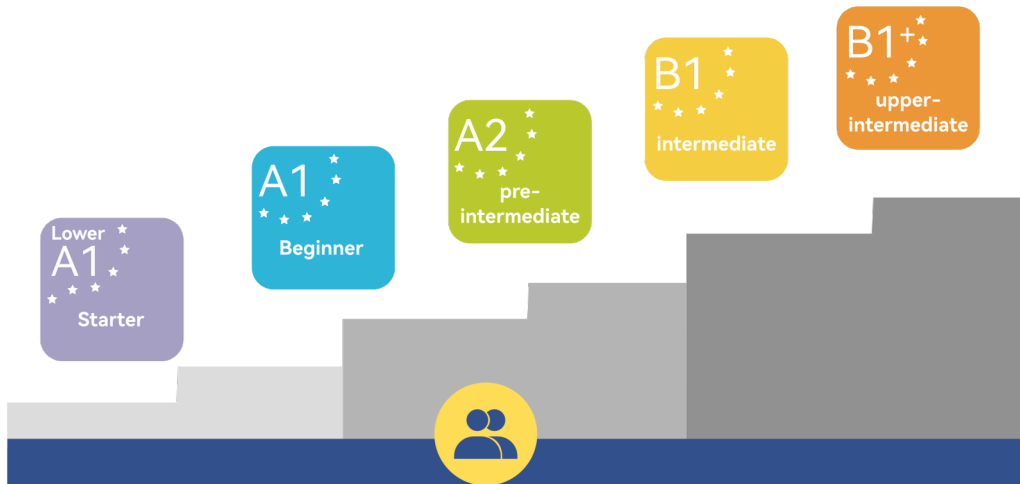

The High School Preparation (HSP) course offered by AIL uses the full suite of curriculum and award-winning syllabi developed by John Paul International College (JPIC). These documents are detailed, CEFR-aligned, and structured in a week-by-week format across levels from Starter to Upper-Intermediate, with clear mapping of learning outcomes, assessment tasks, linguistic targets, and academic skill development.

Homestay & Airport Pickup Service

AIL uses Togoto Australia for the airport pick up service. AIL partners up with Melbourne Intercultural Learning Centre (MILC) providing onsite boarding services with 46 beds and full meal services. AIL also works with the Australian Homestay Network (AHN) and OziHouse to provide homestay services to our young international students.
