# **AIL Primary School Preparation Course (PSP)**


The PSP course is designed for young international learners preparing to enter upper primary levels in the Australian school system. Students are likely to come from a wide range of educational and cultural backgrounds, most commonly from countries across Asia.

### **PSP Course Objectives**

The learning goal of the AIL Primary School Preparation (PSP) course is to equip international primary-aged students with the English language skills, academic foundations, and cultural understanding needed to transition confidently and successfully into Australian primary schools.

#### **PSP Course Focus**

The course focuses on developing students' abilities in listening, reading, writing, and speaking, while also building classroom language, critical thinking, and social skills essential for participation in mainstream education.



### **PSP Course Structure and Levels**

The PSP program at AIL is delivered in two progressive levels to cater for the varying English proficiency and academic readiness of international primary-aged students:

Level 1: (approx. Victorian Curriculum Levels 3 – 4)

Designed for students who are new to English or at an early stage of language development. Focus is placed on building core communication skills, classroom routines, and foundational literacy and numeracy using English as the medium of instruction.

• Level 2: (approx. Victorian Curriculum Levels 5 - 6)

Designed for students with emerging or intermediate English proficiency. This level introduces subject-based academic language (Maths, Science, Humanities), enhances writing and comprehension skills, and prepares students for integration into Years 4–6 of mainstream primary school.



Both levels are aligned with the Victorian Curriculum F– 10, ensuring students are developing age-appropriate language and cognitive skills for successful transition to Australian schools.

In the AIL Primary School Preparation (PSP) course, time is carefully allocated to each subject area to ensure balanced development of academic English, subject-specific knowledge, and essential study skills. While exact hours may vary slightly depending on student level and program structure, a typical weekly schedule includes:

# • Core English:

20 hours/ wk

(Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking)

Focuses on academic English development, including grammar, vocabulary, essay writing, and comprehension.



# • English for Mathematics:

1 hour/wk

Builds subject-specific language skills needed to understand and solve mathematical problems.



# English for Science:

1 hour/wk

Introduces scientific language, report writing, and comprehension of science-related texts and experiments.



### Humanities-related Studies:

(e.g., History, Geography, Civics)

#### 1 hour/wk

Focuses on history, geography, civics, and economics in Australian contexts.



### • Physical Education (PE):

#### 1 hour/wk

Supports physical well-being and helps students adapt to group interaction and instruction in English.



## Study Skills & Critical Thinking Workshops:

#### 1 hour/wk

Covers time management, research, exam techniques, and reflection to build independent learning habits.



### **AIL PSP Course Syllabus**

The Primary School Preparation (PSP) course at AIL is delivered using the full suite of curriculum and award-winning syllabus developed by John Paul International College (JPIC). These materials are comprehensive, CEFR-aligned, and structured in a detailed week-by-week format across two levels. Importantly, the curriculum has been carefully mapped to the Victorian F–10 Curriculum, with learning objectives aligned to its outcomes.



### **Extracurricular Activities**

AlL offers a well-planned and enriching after-class activities program for our PSP students, featuring museum and art gallery visits, STEM projects, Botanic Gardens scavenger hunts, cultural show-and-share sessions, and a wide range of sports activities. ### **Homestay & Airport Pickup Service**

AIL uses Togoto Australia for the airport pick up service. AIL partners up with Melbourne Intercultural Learning Centre (MILC) providing onsite boarding services with 46 beds and full meal services. AIL also works with the Australian Homestay Network (AHN) and OziHouse to provide homestay services to our young international students.

AIL PSP courses are delivered by highly experienced Australian teachers. All teachers hold a recognised TESOL qualification and at least a Bachelor's degree in Education, Linguistics, TESOL, or a related field.
